

Hurricane Dorian Relief Donation Locations and Information

In Miami-Dade County, four county government locations will be open Tuesday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. accepting donations.

County officials ask that donations be limited to items requested by the government of The Bahamas.

- Water.
- Non-perishable foods.
- Hygiene kits (tissue, toothpaste, tooth brushes, towels, sanitary napkins).
- Cleaning supplies (bleach, mops, brooms, garbage bags, sponges, clothes pins).
- Disinfectants.
- Baby formula, bottles and supplies.
- Jerry cans (plastic water bottles).
- Beds, cots.
- Blankets.
- Portable toilets.
- Flashlights.
- Batteries.
- Mosquito repellent (DEET-free).
- Cooking utensils.
- Temporary housing.
- Tarpaulins.
- Plastic sheeting.
- Plywood.
- Roof shingles.
- Generators.
- Chain saws.
- Shovels.
- Disposable plates and eating utensils.
- Power banks.
- Solar-powered chargers.
- Portable radios (battery or crank).
- Cloth bags or biodegradable bags.
- First aid kits (bandages, gauze and tape).

The Bahamian consulate in Miami has set up three drop-off sites where they will be collecting donated goods for those affected by Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas.
