A RESOLTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE TOWN MANAGER TO APPLY FOR A **GRANT FROM** THE LAND **AND** WATER THE **FLORIDA FUND OF** CONSERVATION DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FOR REFURBISHMENT OF MIAMI LAKES PARK; PROVIDING COMMITMENT OF MATCHING FUNDS; AUTHORIZING TOWN OFFICIALS TO TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TO MOVE FORWARD WITH THE GRANT **EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZING** APPLICATION: BUDGETED **FUNDS**; AND **PROVIDING** FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection ("FDEP") provides grants to local governments for acquisition or development of land for public outdoor recreation through its Land and Water Conservation Fund (the "LAWCF"); and

WHEREAS, these are competitive grant programs for local governmental entities responsible for outdoor recreational sites and facilities for the use and benefit of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Town wishes to make application to the LAWCF for funds to refurbish Miami Lakes Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Recitals.</u> The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Authorizing Grant Application. The Town Council of the Town of Miami Lakes hereby authorizes the Town Manager to make application for a grant

with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection Land and Water Conservation Fund to refurbish Miami Lakes Park in the amount of \$200,000.00 (attached as Exhibit "A") for project costs of \$400,000.00, and in connection with such application to execute such grant agreement and other contracts and documents, to execute any necessary amendments to the grant application and contracts, and take such other acts as may be necessary to bind the Town and accomplish the intent of this resolution.

Section 3. Authorization of Matching Funds. If awarded the grant, the Town agrees to commit 50% matching funds in the amount of \$200,000.00.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Authorization of Town Officials.</u> The Town Manager and Town Attorney are authorized to take all steps necessary to move forward with the grant application.

Section 5. Authorization of Fund Expenditure. The Town Manager is authorized to expend budgeted funds to implement the terms and conditions of the grant application.


Section 6. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.


