

RESOLUTION NO. 10-851

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA; DENYING THE REQUEST OF PEDRO MORIN AND SUSAN MORIN TO REDUCE A PREVIOUSLY ASSESSED CODE COMPLIANCE FINE FOR CASE NO. C2009-0867; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Miami Lakes (the "Town"), through its Code Compliance Department, issued Citation No. C2009-0867 ("Citation") to Pedro Morin and Susan Morin (the "Owners"); and

WHEREAS, a Citation was issued and the violation was subsequently corrected; and

WHEREAS, the Owners have incurred a fine of \$5,382.65; and

WHEREAS, the Owners have requested that the Town reduce the fine and the Town Manager having reviewed the file has recommended the Town Council not reduce the fine leaving the full amount of \$5,382.65 to be paid; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Denial for Request for Reduction of Fine. The civil penalty/fine reduction request for Code Compliance Case No. C2009-0867 is denied. The Civil Penalty/fine remains \$5,382.65.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.

PASSED AND ADOPTED this 12 day of October 2010.


