#### **ORDINANCE 25-336**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 13, "LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE", AT ARTICLE VI, "SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS"; CREATING SECTION 13-777.1 "ONLINE SALES SHOWROOMS"; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS OF FACT, INTENT AND PURPOSE; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION INTO THE CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Morera)

**WHEREAS**, in 2008, the Town of Miami Lakes (the "Town") adopted a Land Development Code (the "LDC") in order to provide for uniform standards throughout the Town's distinct zoning areas; and

**WHEREAS**, among the items covered in the LDC are regulations regarding the operation of businesses, including the use of physical locations for commercial purposes; and

WHEREAS, the rise of online retail and e-commerce has led to a new type of business model, referred to as "online sales showrooms," where businesses operate primarily through online platforms but utilize physical locations for product display, marketing, and limited customer interaction; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council recognizes the need to address the unique characteristics of online sales showrooms, including the potential impact on local zoning regulations, signage, and parking requirements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council has directed the Town attorney to review the LDC and propose amendments to regulate online sales showrooms in a manner consistent with the Town's zoning goals, ensuring that such businesses comply with the Town's overall vision for business operations while accommodating the evolving nature of commerce; and

**WHEREAS**, this Ordinance addresses the immediate need to regulate online sales showrooms, ensuring they align with the Town's land use policies and the appropriate zoning standards.

WHEREAS, on April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025, the Town Council passed the proposed Ordinance in First Reading; and

**THEREFORE**, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MIAMI LAKES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing Recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Adoption of Amendments to Chapter 13, Article IX of the Town Code. The Town Council approves and adopts the Amendments to Chapter 13, Article IX of the Town Code as provided herein to specifically address the regulation of online sales showrooms.

**Section 3. Repeal of Conflicting Provisions.** All provisions of the Code of the Town of Miami Lakes that are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**Section 4. Severability.** The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance, which shall remain in effect. It is the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

Section 5. Inclusion in the Town Code. It is the intention of the Town Council, and it is hereby ordained, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made part of the Town Code, and that if necessary, the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such intention; and that the word "Ordinance" shall be changed to "Article," "Division," or another appropriate word.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption on second reading.

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# Sec. 13-777.1. – Online Sales Showroom/ Modified Retail

(a) Any request for an online sales showroom use in the RO Districts shall be processed as a minor conditional use, regardless of the size of the proposed establishment. The applicant shall be required to request renewal of the minor conditional use on an annual basis.

(b) An online sales showroom in the RO Districts shall be permitted only where its entrance is interior to an office building and shall not be permitted to have signage or other advertising on the exterior of the building.

(c) Online sales showrooms in the RO Districts shall occupy in the aggregate no more than 15 percent of the total square footage of the office building in which it is located.

(d) As part of the minor conditional use process, the Administrative Official may impose conditions upon the operation of the use, including but not limited to hours of operation, the extent to which retail sales and storage of products will be allowed on-site, and whether the showroom may accept walk-in customers (without appointment).
